INTRODUCTION

Each follower of Jesus is called to live on mission in an age of a global pandemic.

It is written with the hope that through these stories and images, "... the eyes of our hearts will be opened so that we can know the hope of our calling as His holy people." – Ephesians 1:18

We see so much in our world today. We can be overwhelmed and distracted by the news around us – which are often stories of suffering and images of conflict. But as a gospel-centered and globally engaged church, we know that the injustice and unrest are only a part of the picture.

God is not surprised by our present circumstances. He always has a good and able plan, and we are called to be those who see and share the good news of His redemptive work.

When we see images of those suffering in hospitals or those who are trapped in isolation, we know of and we support those who are faithfully sharing Christ's hope online, dropping care packages off at doors, making phone calls, standing at windows with encouraging signs, and sharing the love of Christ in ways we never imagined before.

Our hope is that this report will help you to see Christ in the midst of the challenging situations through people of faith and vision – people just like you! As we are encouraged and challenged to see and know differently, we are also called to help others to see and know Christ at work in their own lives and in our world.

MISSION RESOURCE ADVISORY

Our Mission Resource Advisory (MRA) is a committee of advisors who commit to prayerful discernment of the mission strategy and priorities of The Peoples Church. From this prayerful and strategic perspective, they carefully consider how mission resources are shared with our partners. The MRA examines the details of each application for support from our mission partners and submits their recommendations to our Board of Directors for approval. Once approved, resources are released with blessing to our partners around the world. Members of this advisory represent diverse cultural perspectives and gifting, and are appointed based upon their experience and commitment to mission.

Coming to Canada from Lebanon, Zareh brings an important perspective as a diaspora missionary. He is gifted in organizational project management and combines this gifting with a pastor's heart. As Missionary Care Pastor for the church, he brings unique insight into the ministries of our missionaries.

For many years, we were considered a "missionarysending" church, but sending missionaries was only one part of how God was leading us to share the love of Christ with every nation of the world. It would be much more accurate to say that God has called us to be a "missionary-mobilizing" church.

One of our mission partnership criteria is that the ministries we support are committed to developing and mobilizing leaders. Of our 216 supported missionaries, one third of them are indigenous leaders serving their own people in situations where local financial support is simply not possible.

These missionaries represent only a fraction of the indigenous global leaders we help mobilize for mission through online training programs like TELL in Latin America; leadership conferences like Jossour in the Middle East; and missionary teams like Friends of Nepal. Our partners are always developing

innovative and culturally sensitive training programs and ministry models to develop and deploy missionaries.

We also recognize and rejoice that God is sending missionaries to Canada, and we are blessed to welcome missionaries who come to us from around the world through diaspora migration. Working closely with our partners like Tyndale TIM Centre and Lausanne Canada, we seek to train and integrate these mission leaders into Canadian churches, or prepare them to be mobilized to global locations, sometimes returning as rebound missionaries to their home countries.

Our greatest mobilization in mission by far, is within our own congregation, as each person commits to making their neighbourhood, school, and workplace a daily ministry for sharing the good news of Christ. The mobilization of missionaries in our neighbourhoods and around the world continues to be the primary commitment of our church as we engage in God's global mission.

OPERATION WORLD 2021

Our Faith Promise gifts helped to construct a dormitory for women at a Bible seminary in Southern India where women are being trained in the Bible, theology, and a trade so that they can return to their rural villages and support themselves as they plant churches.

SEE MIGRATION DIFFERENTLY

"Those who had been scattered preached the word wherever they went." - Acts 8:4

Global migration is one of the most powerful ways God has spread His gospel throughout history. During these days of the global pandemic, it has felt as if the world came to a stop - which has been frustrating for us but devastating for those who are vulnerable.

Refugees who were fleeing dangerous situations are trapped in 'in-between' spaces, unable to move forward and unable to go back. The pandemic has separated loved ones, and fear has caused people to become less welcoming when people need to be welcomed the most.

Migration continues to be considered problematic in political arenas and in the media, but the Church sees that God is still at work in this movement of people. He continues to bring new life to His people and to His Church through migration.

At The Peoples Church, we see God at work in global migration and eagerly join Him there. Supporting migration ministries in Greece, Colombia, Uganda, Egypt, Malawi, Kenya, Lebanon, and Spain, we see unprecedented opportunity to share the gospel with people who are open and willing to hear about a God who lovingly welcomes them.

Here in Toronto, we are intentional about welcoming people well, and ensuring that they are integrated into the life of the Church. Our Newcomers Ministry and Refugee Welcome Ministry are our most vibrant outreach ministries. International students are coming to know Christ and becoming godly leaders here in Canada or back in their home countries. Refugees are finding hope and healing as they hear the gospel that was silenced in the countries from which they fled.











CANADIAN COUNCIL FOR REFUGEES

We are active in welcoming newcomers to Canada in the name of Jesus through our newcomers and refugee ministries. Over 70% of our baptisms last year were people who had immigrated to Canada and heard the good news of Christ. New Canadians are bringing new life to our church and communities!

- For those who have been forced from their homes and face uncertain futures, particularly during the pandemic
- For those who are separated from their loved ones - that they would be comforted in their separation and reunited as soon as possible
- That we would be a welcoming church ready to see the gifts of those who are being sent by God to our church

Media has taken an inordinately important place in our daily lives during this pandemic. While we should be aware of the potential dangers of technology and media, we must also embrace the remarkable opportunities media provides for sharing the gospel when used correctly.

Our partners around the world are able to worship with us through our online Sunday gatherings, and our online Life Groups make it possible for those who are shut in to be included. Online training for Christian leaders in Latin America, discipleship

lessons for refugees in Europe, Biblical Family Values television programming in the Middle East, and Bible teachings via radio broadcasts in Iran, are just a few of the media projects we support around the world to share the gospel and disciple believers.

We know that online teaching and gatherings can only ever supplement in-person relationships in the church - media cannot replace relationship. However, media and caring relationships are a powerful combination for sharing the gospel and discipling believers.



CHRISTIANITY TODAY

In Quebec, our mission partners at Aujourd'hui L'Espoir use television and radio broadcasting to share the gospel with rural Quebec. Their Hope Line call center offers the opportunity for listeners to engage in real conversations, after which they are offered to be connected with a local church for personal follow up.

- For the people of Quebec, that more and more would experience the love of Jesus
- For believers in Iran who are unable to gather freely together, but have access to learning about faith through media
- For our own Media & Communications team, that they will be Spirit-led and effective in sharing the gospel and discipling believers
- For media outreach in countries that are closed to the gospel

SEE INNOVATION DIFFERENTLY

He sent them out to proclaim the kingdom of God and to perform healing. - Luke 9:2



Each person who believes in Jesus is called to minister in the areas they study or work. But sometimes, God calls people out of existing social models and systems, and gives them vision for innovative initiatives that develop just models of ministry based on sustainable kingdom principles.

At The Peoples Church we want to support these kingdom initiatives and see how God can do a new thing through His people. This past year, we hosted our fair-trade market online so that we could continue to support industries that seek to do business using fair production and distribution models. We are also exploring new possibilities with our partners at FaithTech as they develop new kingdom models for how media is used.

Our partners at TearFund are active in sustainable

farming initiatives across Africa and Latin America, particularly in areas where famine or flooding has devastated whole communities and restoration is about finding ways to heal the land. Using a churchbased development approach, they work with communities to find new ways of sustainable living.

This past Christmas we raised awareness and funds for the Mully Children's Family (MCF) ministry in Kenya, which models the power and beauty of applied biblical principles of justice, creation care, and sustainability. In addition to caring for orphans, they have changed the climate of their region by simply implementing kingdom principles of living.

There are many ways to live justly in our broken society, and as a church we want to actively pursue these kingdom models with our partners.



Our partners at 24/7 Prayer are launching a spiritual apprenticeship program that encourages just lifestyle practices and creation care through training in organic farming and artisan trade. Spiritual practices such as prayer, Bible study, and loving service are combined with the rhythm of planting, growing, and producing, to encourage a deeply spiritual and fruitful lifestyle of discipleship.

We Pray

- For workers around the world who are not receiving fair wages for their work
- For a change of heart in those areas of our living that perpetuate unjust practices and systems
- For creative and courageous new models for Christian living and ministry based on sustainable kingdom



SEE MISSION TEAM EXPERIENCES DIFFERENTLY

Mission team experiences are one of the most effective ways we stay connected with our global partners, and a vital component in discipleship at our church. Many mission team participants have described their experience as life-changing.

We send teams to different communities in our world and welcome teams here in Toronto, to learn and grow together. Through our teams we are able to share encouragement and create strong connections within our congregation and our global mission partners as we serve Christ together.

The only mission team we were able to send out in 2020 was our Youth Team that travelled to the Dominican Republic. The team had to return much earlier than planned due to travel restrictions that were instituted in March 2020.


The young people on the team were heartbroken at having to return so soon after their arrival. The disappointment of this unexpected return taught

each team member much about trusting God with our disappointment and allowing Him to work His purposes despite our unfulfilled plans.

All subsequent mission team experiences remain suspended until travel restrictions are lifted and it becomes safe to travel and visit our international partners again.

This break in travelling has created a new virtual mission team experience where we have been meeting with our international partners online for prayer, worship, and to learn about what God is doing in their ministries. We have met online for fellowship with our partners in Mexico, Uganda, Zimbabwe, Lebanon, and the Middle East. Although it is not the same as travelling in person to experience their ministries, these online gatherings have created possibilities for many more to participate and stay connected with our international partners, and we are so thankful for the technology that makes these connections possible.

SEE URGENT BENEVOLENCE DIFFERENTLY

...Come quickly to me, O God. You are my help and my deliverer; Lord, do not delay. - Psalm 70:5

When crises occur in our world, we are able to respond with support promptly, effectively, and generously - this is the power of our Faith Promise giving. Through our consistent and faithful giving, God continues to provide a store of resources so that we can support the urgent needs of our partners serving in areas that are facing emergency situations. A portion of our Global Mission budget is allocated specifically for global crises. Once funds are gifted to our partners in need, the resources are again replenished by our faithful, consistent giving.

It is always a concern to ensure the resources that are sent during a crisis actually get to the people in need. We always send our Faith Promise gifts to trusted partners who work with the local church network in the crisis area so that the response is reliable and holistic - meeting not only physical and material needs, but emotional and spiritual needs as well. When the attention of the world has moved on to new matters, God's people are still working with disaster-affected communities to bring about longterm recovery and healing.

In 2019, we came together to support our brothers and sisters facing the refugee crisis in Venezuela. The community gardens that were planted with our gifts by the local churches are now thriving and helping to feed people as they rebuild their communities.

This year, the needs caused by natural disasters were compounded by the pandemic, causing the need for urgent benevolence to be even greater than usual. In addition to providing support during Cyclone Amphan in India, severe flooding in Nepal and Bangladesh, and the tragic explosion in Lebanon, we were able to provide prompt, effective, and generous support to our partners in seven countries facing overwhelming circumstances during the pandemic.

Urgent benevolence is a clear testimony to the love and care of Christ when crises affect His people. Consistent and faithful giving has encouraged many, at the most difficult time of their lives, to "praise their Father in heaven" for His answer to prayer.











Earlier last month, local authorities advised digging graves, as they did not foresee receiving oxygen tanks... Together we provided more than 50 oxygen tanks to the towns of Canutama, Lábrea and Pauni. In one of the tank deliveries, a hospital director shared, "The tanks arrived just in time. We were practically out of oxygen."

PARTNERS INTERNATIONAL

Our partners in Brazil received our Faith Promise gifts to bring PPE, oxygen, and food to their people living along the Amazon River who were battling COVID. They brought the hope of Christ and answered the prayers of a people living in fear, hunger, and isolation.




